# SOCIO-ECONOMIC STATUS



## What is Socio-Economic Status (SES)?

Socio-economic status (SES) is used to describe a variety of social and economic conditions within a geographic area of residence. For example, income, employment and education are most commonly used to determine the general SES of individuals, neighbourhoods or communities. Other factors also have important effects on SES, including ethnicity, language, citizenship, etc.

## Why are SES factors important?

In Canada, child development is influenced by various socio-economic circumstances that have created a “developmental gradient” (i.e. an incremental, step-wise trend) that moves along the socio-economic spectrum.

In Canada, inequalities in child development emerge in a systematic fashion over the first five years of life according to well-organized factors: **family income, parental education, parenting style, neighborhood safety and cohesion, neighborhood socioeconomic differences, and access to quality child care and developmental opportunities.** By age 5, a ‘gradient’ in the early child development emerges, such that, the average quality of early child experiences increases.<sup>1</sup>

## How does HELP collect socio-economic data?

Statistics Canada (Stats Canada) gathers census data on the socio-economic characteristics of the Canadian population every five years. SES variables are mapped using data obtained from the 2001 Census. Data from the 2006 Census won’t be available to researchers until 2008.

For the ECD Mapping Project, HELP selects and maps SES indicators that are useful for understanding the social characteristics of a neighborhood and how those characteristics might influence early child development. HELP purchases customized datasets from Stats Canada for the 0-6 age range for all of BC. These data files consist of full population values (unsuppressed) for over 1,200 variables from the 2001 Census, processed by the same neighborhood boundaries that are used to analyze the EDI results. This allows communities to consider relationships between the EDI results and the socio-economic character of their local neighborhoods.

## What SES variables are mapped?

Currently HELP uses a suite of 23 SES variables identified as being relevant to ECD trends.

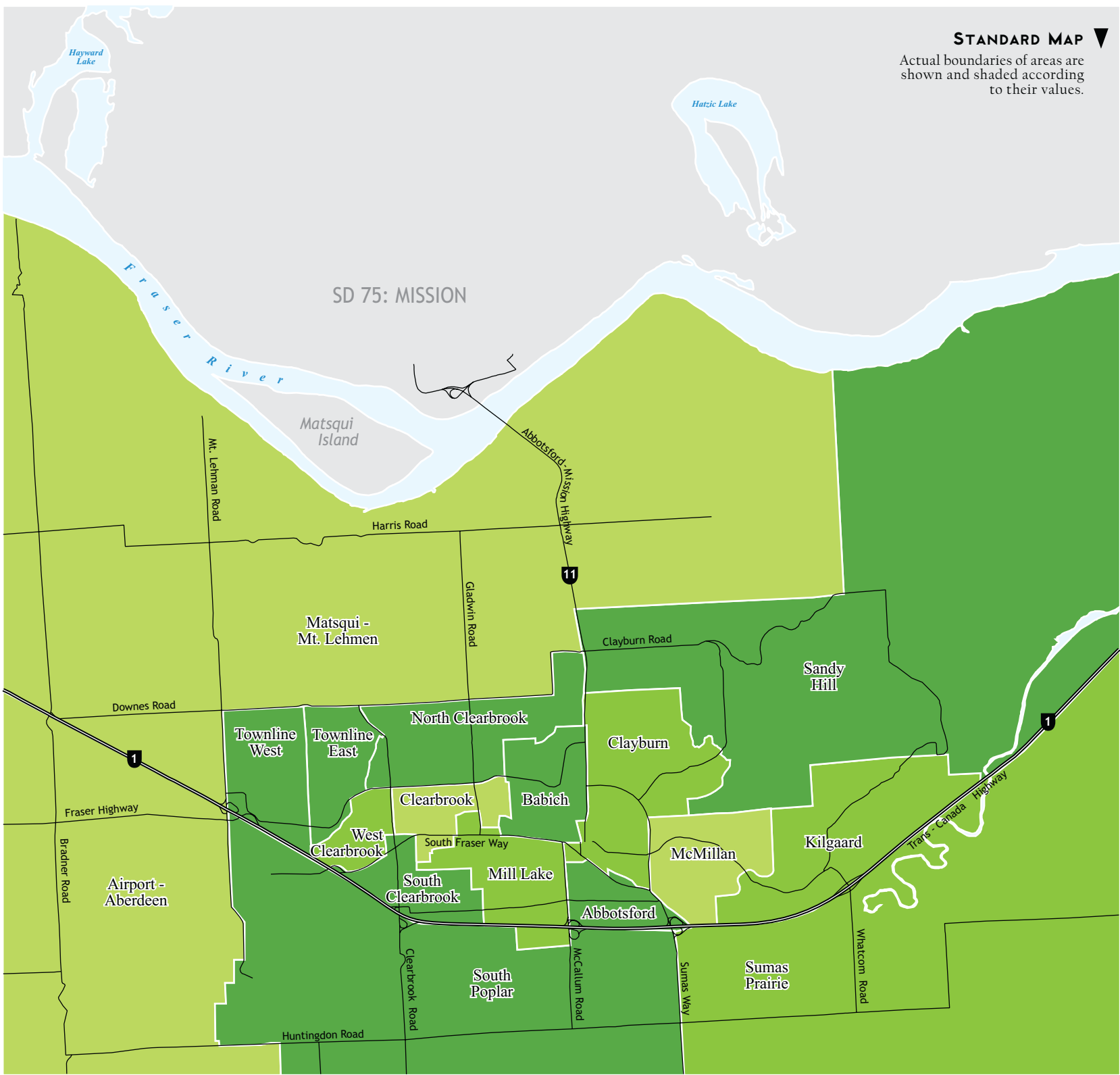

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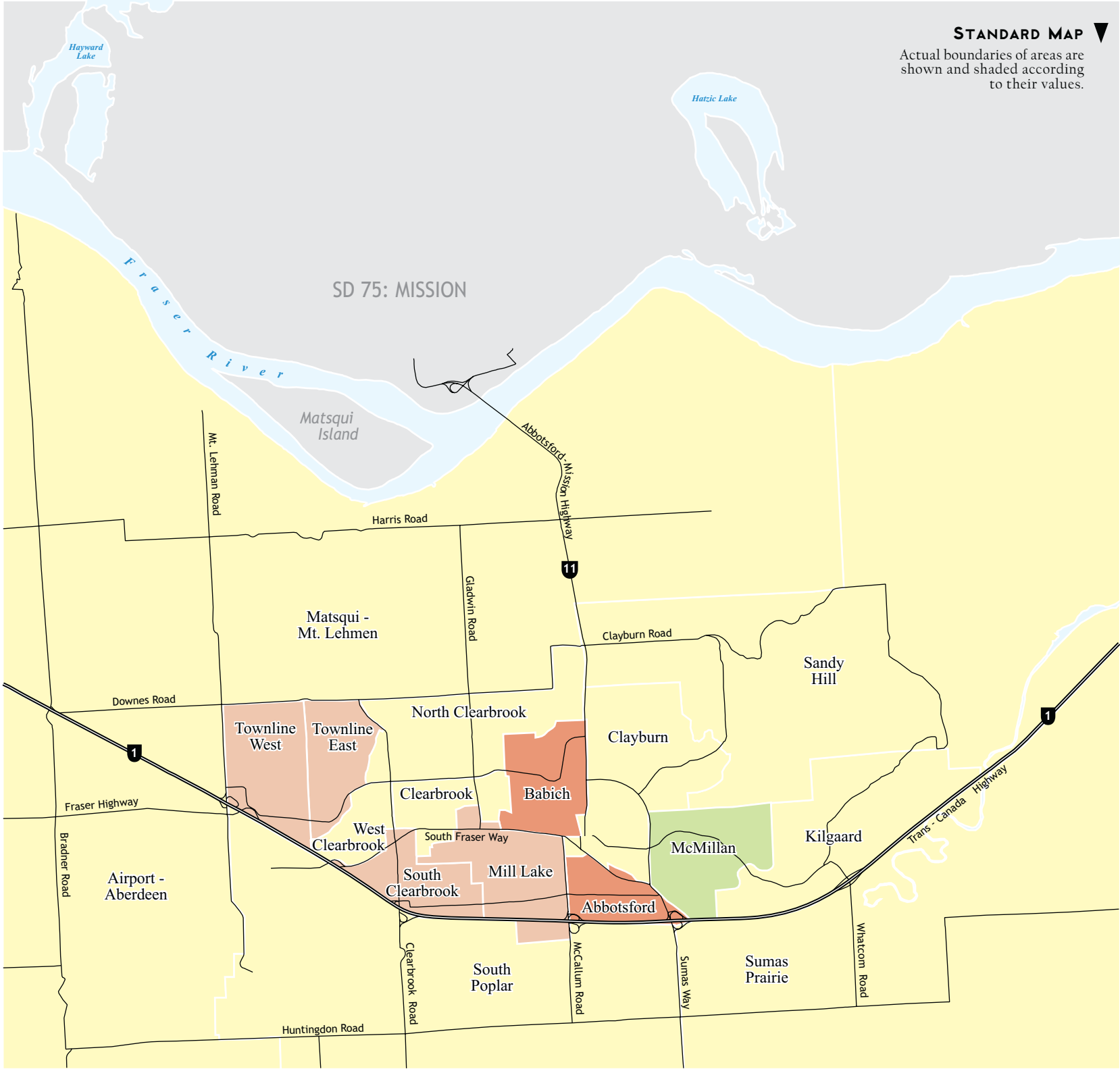

As such, the social index is a number from zero through nine. A nine indicates that a region is 'worse' than the national average on nine of the nine socioeconomic risk factors - a high degree of SES risk. A zero, conversely, indicates that the region is 'worse' than the national average on NONE of the nine SES factors.
